

**NOTIFICATION OF ARAB CONTRACTORS AND CONSULTANT WITH  
PROJECTS AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE OPERATIONS  
FINANCED BY THE ARAB BANK FOR ECONOMIC  
DEVELOPMENT IN AFRICA (BADEA)**

The Board of Directors of the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA), in its session held during the period 11-13 March 2009, has approved loans and grants for some African countries.

The total amount of the approved financing is US\$ 83.385 million, of which US \$ 80.940 million are earmarked, as loans, for participation in financing of ten development projects and US\$ 2.445 million are allocated for financing nine technical assistance operations.
