

A) Projects:

1) The Central African Republic:

A loan amounting to US \$ 3.33 million to finance Health Centre Project.

2) The State of Eritrea:

A loan amounting to US \$ 4.50 million to finance National Radiotherapy Centre.

3) The Republic of Benin:

An additional loan amounting to US \$ 1.85 million to finance Akpro–Misséréké–Kpédékpo Road Project.

4) The Republic of Madagascar:

A loan amounting to US \$ 5.00 million to finance the Rehabilitation of the infrastructure of "Sainte Marie" Island.

5) The Republic of Chad:

A loan amounting to US \$ 6.80 million to finance Development of Fishing.

Beneficiary Country:

The Central African Republic

Project's Name:

Health Centre Project

BADEA's Financing:

A loan amounting to US \$ 3.33 million, to be repaid over a period of 30 years, including a grace period of 10 years, with an annual interest rate of 1%.

Other Co- financiers:

Government (US \$ 0.37 million).

Estimated Project Cost:

The total project cost is estimated at US \$ 3.7 million.

Project Description:

The project comprises of construction of 22 clinic centres in six health districts in the country. The construction of the clinics will include provision of electricity and water supply and construction of 8 water wells and 38 houses for personnel's working in the Health Sector. The project includes civil works and assistance to the Project Implementation Unit, in addition to the consultancy services.

Project objectives:

The project aims at providing and expanding the health services in the country, in general and improving the health of women and children in particular. This will be realized through expanding the health centres in 6 provinces of the country and by reducing the death incidents occurring during pregnancy and labour and through creation of awareness among the population of the targeted provinces; in addition the project is expected to reduce poverty in the project areas.

Procurement of Goods and Services:

- Services for civil works will be procured through Regional Competitive Bidding involving Arab, African or Arab – African contractors.
- Supply and installation of Medical Equipment including electrical supply works and radio communication units will be through known foreign suppliers.
- Supply of vehicles and office furniture and equipment for the project implementation unit will be through local suppliers.
- Consultancy services will be procured through short list of Arab, African or Arab -African consultant.

Project's Implementation:

It is expected that works relating to the project will start at the beginning of the second quarter of the year 2008 and will finish by the end of the first quarter of the year 2010.

The Ministry of Health and Population will be the responsible of the follow-up and the supervision of the execution of the project.

Beneficiary Country:

The State of Eritrea

Project's Name:

Construction of National Radiotherapy Centre.

BADEA's Financing:

A loan amounting to US \$ 4.5 million, to be repaid over a period of 30 years, including a grace period of 10 years, and an annual interest rate of 1%.

Other Co- financiers:

OPEC Fund (US \$ 1 million), Government of Eritrea (US \$ 0.675 million).

Estimated Project Cost:

The total project cost is estimated at (US \$ 6.175 million).

Project Description:

The project consists of construction, supply and installations of equipment for Radiography centre inside Aworota hospital. The project also includes training for the workers and Intuitional Support for the project implementation unit and consultancy services.

Project objectives:

The project aims at supporting the Government's policy towards expanding and improving the health services and providing basic health needs to the people in general and provision of treatment for cancer diseases by establishing radiotherapy centre, in particular.

Procurement of Goods and Services:

Supply and installation of medical and other equipment will be through ICB, in coordination with OPEC Fund.

Service for civil works will be procured through competitive bidding involving local, Arab or African firms.

Training services will be undertaken by qualified institutions and in coordination with the OPEC.

Consultancy service will be procured through short list of Arab, African or Arab -African consultants.

Project's Implementation:

The Ministry of Health will be responsible for the execution of the project. It is expected that work starts in beginning of 2008 and finishes at the end of 2009.

Beneficiary Country:

The Republic of Benin

Project's Name:

Akpro – Misséréte - Kpédékpo Road Project.

BADEA's Financing:

An additional loan of US \$ 1.85 million, to be repaid over a period of 30 years, including a grace period of 10 years, and an annual interest rate of 1%.

Other Co- financiers:

Islamic Development Bank (US \$ 5.14 million), OPEC Fund (US \$ 3.40 million) and the Government of Benin (US \$ 1.08 million).

Estimated Project Cost:

The new total project cost is estimated at US \$ 31.21 million.

Project Description:

The project comprises of rehabilitation of the current Akpro – Misséréte – Kpédékpo ground road, which is 89 km long and 7 meter wide including two side extensions each 1.5-meter wide and two bridges each with 45 meter length. The project will include civil works and consultancy services.

Project objectives:

The project aims at ending the isolation of the south- eastern part of the country through provision of access road to ensure reliable and safe transportation of agricultural products from this part of the country to the market places in the Capital and to the port of Cotonou. The project will minimize cost of transportation for the people and the commodities and reduce cost of maintenance of the current ground road.

Procurement of Goods and Services:

KARA-FADOUL, the contractor who was already selected for this project before, will be responsible for the implementation of the civil works.

Project's Implementation:

The Ministry of Public Works and Transport through its National Directorate of Public Works will be responsible for the supervision and the execution of the project.
The work started in 2005 and will last 24 months to finish in third quarters from the year 2007.

Beneficiary Country:

The Republic of Madagascar

Project's Name:

Rehabilitation of the Infrastructure of "Sainte Marie" Island.

BADEA's Financing:

A loan of US \$ 5 million, to be repaid over a period of 30 years, including a grace period of 10 years, and an annual interest rate of 1%.

Other Co - financiers:

OPEC Fund (US \$ 2.80 million) and the Government of Madagascar (US \$ 1.2 million).

Estimated Project Cost:

The total project cost is estimated at US \$ 9 million.

Project Description:

The project is located in the island of "Sainte Marie" east of Madagascar. The project comprises the construction of the third part of the road connecting the towns of Ioukantsi and Ambudiatana. The road will be 24.5 m long, 5 meter wide and will have 2 side extensions each 0.5 m wide. The project also includes construction of the first part of the road linking the first and the second part, which is 900m long, 4.5 m wide including two walking pavement each 1m wide.

Project objectives:

The project aims at rehabilitating some of the infrastructures of the island of Saint Marie". This includes rehabilitation of the roads network, the ports of Madam and Barachoa and improvement of the terrestrial and maritime transport conditions in the island. As the result of the rehabilitation it is expected to decrease the cost of transport of people and goods and reduce poverty.

Procurement of Goods and Services:

The civil works will be executed international competitive bidding. The consultancy services will be procured on the basis of short list of Arab, African or Arab-African firms according to BADEA's procedures.

Project's Implementation:

The Ministry of Public Works, Transport and Meteorology will be responsible of the execution of the project. It is expected that the project starts end of the first quarter 2008, for 24 months duration, and will end towards the end of the first quarter 2009.

Beneficiary Country:

The Republic of Chad

Project's Name:

Development of Fishing Project.

BADEA's Financing:

A loan of an amount of US \$ 6.8 million, to be repaid over a period of 30 years, including a grace period of 10 years, and an annual interest rate of 1%.

Other Co- financiers:

African Development Fund (US \$ 15.30 million), the Government of Chad (US \$ 3.90 million).

Estimated Project Cost:

The total project cost is estimated at US \$ 26.00 million.

Project Description:

The project is considered as the first BADEA's intervention in the fishery sector and concentrates on providing support to public, private and professional institutions to develop their capacities and improve their activities towards exploiting and preserving the fish resource. The project will also involve supply of necessary equipment and construction of basic infrastructure for fishing and marketing and provision of consultancy services.

Project objectives:

The project aims at improving the method of fishing, preserving and marketing by providing institutional support to public, private and local cooperatives involved in fishery. The project will contribute towards improving the living condition of the population, ensuring food security, minimizing poverty. The project will also help in protecting the environment and exploitation of the fishing resource in addition to achieving development integration.

Procurement of Goods and Services:

Procurement of civil works for construction of regional offices for the administration of the fishery business and for rehabilitation of roads will be through local competitive bidding. Supply of means of transportation and office furniture will be from international market through local agents. Micro-credit will be through NGO which will be selected by ADB for the training services. Consultancy service will be procured through short list involving African, Arab or Arab-African firms.

Project's Implementation:

A PIU that will be established under the Ministry of Environment and Water will be responsible through the Project Executing Unity for the execution of the project. It is expected that work starts in mid of the year 2008 and finishes in mid 2011.

Beneficiary Country:

Burkina Faso & the Republics of Mali & Niger

Project's Name:

Reinforcement of the capacities of intervention of the services of protection of the plants and the food products stored in Liptako Gourma area.

BADEA's Financing:

A loan of an amount of US \$ 7.340 million, to be repaid over a period of 30 years, including a grace period of 10 years, and an annual interest rate of 1%.

Other Co- financiers:

The Government of the three countries will participate by US \$ 0.954 million which is 11.5% of total cost, details as follows: the Government of Burkina Faso (US \$ 0.302 million), the Government of Mali (US \$ 0.338 million) and the Government of Niger (US \$ 0.314 million).

Estimated Project Cost:

The total project cost is estimated at US \$ 8.294 million.

Project Description:

The project involves upgrading the network for the control and early warning to fight desert locusts and improving and modernizing utilization of pesticides. The project also include manpower development in the area of plant protection in Burkina Faso, Mali and Niger and institutional support to the PIU and consultancy services to implement the project.

Project objectives:

The project aims at increasing agricultural productivity and improving protection of plants and harvested products to secure food need of the people and animals. This will, in turn, contribute to the improvement of families' income, their living standard and will minimize migration of people to cities and poverty reduction.

Procurement of Goods and Services:

- Civil works for the construction of medical centres control and the stores will be procured through local tender in the country concerned.
- Supply of means of transportation and other equipment including office furniture will be through local suppliers.
- Training will be conducted through specialized African firms.
- Consultancy service will be procured through short list involving African, Arab or Arab-African firms.

Project's Implementation:

The Ministries of Agriculture in the three countries will be responsible of execution the project. It is expected that work starts the mid of the year 2008 and finishes end 2011.

Beneficiary Country:

The Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia

Nature of the Technical Assistance:

A grant for financing a training program as Institution Support for the Transport Authority.

BADEA's Financing:

Un-repayable grant of an amount of US \$ 220 000.

General Information:

The technical assistance aims at upgrading the capacity of the Road Authority through financing a training program to be conducted in the Management Institute for Eastern and Southern Africa. The training will be in the area of personnel management, financial management, and project preparation & appraisal and construction supervision.

Beneficiary Country:

The Republic of Botswana

Nature of the Technical Assistance:

A technical assistance grant amounting to US \$ 195 000 to finance the services of an Arab Expert in the field of Soil Conservation and Prevention of Desertification to provide Institutional Support to the Ministry of Agriculture.

BADEA's Financing:

Un-repayable grant of an amount of US \$ 195 000.

General Information:

The grant aims at providing technical assistance to the Unit responsible for Soil Conservation in the Department of Agricultural and Forestry product, under the Ministry of agriculture, through an Arab Expert in the field of Soil Conservation and Prevention of Desertification. The assistance will enable the unit to upgrade its technical capacity to prepare and implement projects to be financed by different Financing Institutions.

Burkina Faso

Nature of the Technical Assistance:

A technical assistance grant to finance Institutional Support for the Ministry of Finance and Budget.

BADEA's Financing:

Un-repayable grant of an amount of US \$ 210 000.

General Information:

The grant aims of supporting the General Administration for the Budget and General Accounting and General Cooperation Units in the Ministry of Finance and Budget to enable them administer and follow-up all issues concerning Finance and General Debts in a better way. The technical assistance also aims at promoting International Cooperation by supplying equipment and providing training to the staffs to upgrade and develop their professional capacities.
